In other words, each should be answered as if it where a three-page paper.

You are expected to work alone on this exam. I will leave it to you to enforce this amongst yourselves. Suffice it to say, I am an expert in detecting fraudulent work. If I receive two or more similar responses, this will look a little suspicious.

- 1. Using economic analysis, explain why the decriminalization of marijuana could either result in a net social benefit or net social cost to Canadian society. What economic factors should be included in the cost benefit calculation? Is there evidence from other jurisdictions that can be used to guide us?
- 2. Reducing marginal income tax rates in Canada has been touted as policy that would reduce (if not reverse) the migration of highly skilled Canadians to the United States. Using economic analysis evaluate the likely success of such a policy in terms of achieving its objective. What does the evidence say? Also, evaluate this policy based the other consequences of implementation. Compare this to other policies with the same objective. Are these other policies likely to be more of less effective than that of reducing marginal tax rates?
